

#### **Executive Summary**

- □ Nealy 90 days before Ghanaians go to the poll, a new Global InfoAnalytics poll conducted over the phone in all 16 regions shows that 73% of voters believe Ghana is headed in the wrong direction while 20% say it is headed in the right direction, 7% did not have an opinion.
- The poll also finds 63% of voters disapprove the performance of the president while 30% approve and 7% did not have an opinion. However, in the case of the governing party, 6% rated their performance as excellent, 28% as very good/good, 53% rate the government very poor/poor while 13% rate their performance as average.
- □On voters' standard of living compared to a year ago, 20% say it has improved, 55% say it has gotten worse, 19% say it has not changed and 7% did not have an opinion. On corruption, 60% of voters say it has gotten worse, 17% say it has improved, 16% say it has not changed and 7% did not have an opinion.
- □70% of voters have confidence in the security services to manage security during the election while 22% did not have confidence and 8% did not have an opinion. 58% of voters have confidence in the Electoral Commission compared to 30% who did not have confidence in the commission and 12% did not have an opinion.
- ☐ The poll also shows that 77% of voters have some level of concern about electoral violence. Only 23% said they are not concerned at all about violence in the upcoming elections.
- When voters were asked what would have greater influence on their voting decision, the past performance of the parties ranked highest with 54%, followed by current economic condition, 53%, credibility of candidates, 39%, manifestoes, 20% and other reasons, 18%.

☐The poll also finds economy and jobs as the top priority for voters with 86% and 81% of the mentions, followed by education, 40%.
□ When voters were asked which of the leading candidates they believe understands and cares for people like them, 49% said John Dramani Mahama (JDM), 28% said Dr Mahamudu Bawumia (DMB), 1% said Alan Kwadwo Kyeremanten (AKK), 2% said some other persons but 20% said none of them.
For the 2024 general election, using all voters' model, JDM attracts 50.0%, DMB, 29.6%, AKK, 1.0%, NKB, 2.2%, others, 0.5%, undecided, 10.5% and I will not vote, 6.3%. However, among likely voters (exclude "I will not vote"), JDM, leads 53.3%, DMB, 31.6%, AKK, 1.1%, NKB, 2.3%, others, 0.5% and undecided, 11.2%.
The poll also shows that among first-time voters, JDM leads with 53%, DMB, 15%, NKB, 7%, others, 1% and 24% are undecided. However, among non-first-time voters, JDM also leads with 53%, DMB, 33%, AKK, 1%, NKB, 2% and undecided, 11%.
The poll also shows that of all voters who are undecided, 70% are floating voters, 11% are NPP voters, 21% did not disclose their party affiliations and 1% are NDC voters. For those who say they will not vote, 49% are floating voters, 21% are NPP voters, 1% and 28% did not disclose their party affiliations.
□ 12% of NPP voters will vote for JDM if the elections were held today, while 81% will vote for DMB, 1% will vote for AKK, 1% for NKB and 4% are undecided. For NDC voters, 1% will vote for DMB, 97% will vote for JDM, 1% for NKB and 1% are undecided. However, among floating voters, JDM leads with 55%, DMB, 12%, AKK, 1%, NKB, 4% and undecided, 27%. Among those who did not disclose their party affiliations, JDM, 27%, DMB, 19%, NKB, 5%, others, 3% and undecided, 46%.
□ 81% of voters say they are unlikely to change their mind on who they intend to vote for, only 11% say they are to change their mind while 8% are neutral.










## Which of the following have greater influence on you if decide to vote?



























### Parliamentary voting intentions- 2024




# Which Party's candidate did you vote for in the 2020 Parliamentary Elections?




#### How they voted in the 2020 Presidential Elections
