TTAG CALLS ON THE GOVERNMENT OF GHANA TO CLARIFY THE STATUS OF THE 2022 BACKLOG AND 2023 YEAR BATCH AND ADDRESS SALARY ARREARS FOR NEWLY RECRUITED TEACHERS

The Teacher Trainees' Association of Ghana (TTAG) expresses deep concern over the uncertainty surrounding the recruitment and placement of both the **2022 backlog of Trained Teachers** and the **2023 Year Batch**, together with the prolonged delay in the payment of more than ten months of salaries to newly recruited Teachers already serving in classrooms.

Our members, who have committed themselves to national service through teaching, continue to face undue hardship and discouragement as a result of these unresolved matters. TTAG believes that providing clarity on the way forward will not only bring relief to affected teachers but also strengthen confidence in the nation's educational system.

Our Appeals

1. That the Ministry of Education and the Ministry of Finance kindly provide a clear and transparent update on the recruitment and posting processes for both the 2022 backlog and the 2023 Year Batch of Trained Teachers.
2. That the government expedites arrangements to settle the accumulated salary arrears of newly recruited teachers to ease their burden.
3. That timelines for these processes should be communicated to all stakeholders to ensure calm and confidence in the system.

Our Position

TTAG acknowledges the previous steps taken by the Government of Ghana to address some concerns of Teacher Trainees and reiterates its readiness to continue engaging in dialogue with relevant authorities. We therefore call on the Ministry of Education and the Ministry of Finance to act with urgency. Should these concerns remain unaddressed, TTAG will be compelled to explore other legitimate options in defence of the welfare and dignity of our members.
