Methodology and Approach

Summary of Findings

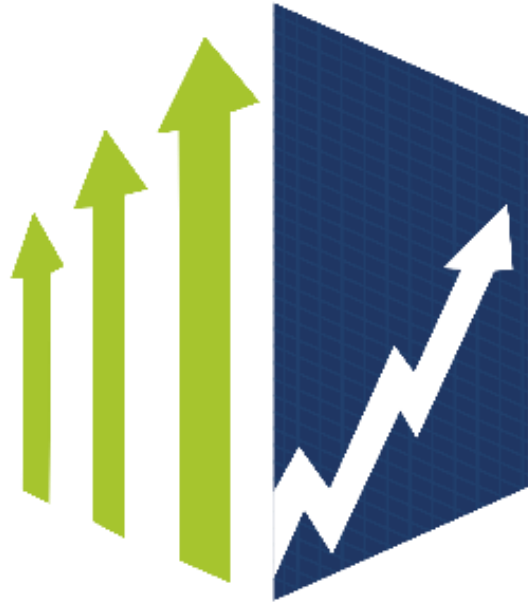
- A new poll by Global InfoAnalytics shows a dramatic shift in the NDC 2028 flagbearer race as the finance minister, Dr Ato Forson, takes over the lead from the party's chairman, General Asiedu Nketia among delegates for the first time. The poll which was conducted between 11th September -13th September shows Ato Forson leads with 32% up from 22% in July 2026 poll while Asiedu Nketia drops from 27% to 23%. Haruna Iddrisu is now on 5% from 6%, Prof. Jane Naana Opoku-Agyemang on 3% down from 7%, Julius Debrah, 4% from 5%, Prof. Joshua Alabi, 2%, up from 1%, Eric Opoku remained unchanged at 1%, while undecided declined from 30% to 28%.
- Dr Ato Forson leads in Ashanti, Central, Eastern, Greater Accra, Western and Western north regions and for the first lead, he leads in the Bono region. Asiedu Nketia leads in Ahafo, Bono East, North East, Savannah, Oti, Upper East, Upper West and Volta regions while Haruna Iddrisu leads in the Northern region. Ato Forson made significant gains in the swing regions compared to the July 2026 poll, where he is up +7% and, in the Akan dominated regions, he gained +16%. Asiedu Nketia on the other hand, gained +10% in the Volta/Oti bloc while Haruna Iddrisu gained +3% in the northern bloc.
- In a head-to-head between Asiedu Nketia and Dr Ato Forson, the poll now shows Ato Forson leading with 41% up from 33% in July 2026 while Asiedu Nketia is on 30% down from 34% with undecided declining from 33% to 29%. However, in a head-to-head between Asiedu Nketia and Haruna Iddrisu, Asiedu Nketia leads with 41% and Haruna Iddrisu 11% with 48% undecided.

Summary of Findings

- Against Prof. Jane Naana Opoku-Agyemang, Asiedu Nketia leads with 44% and Opoku-Agyemang, 7% with another 49% undecided. And against Julius Debrah, Asiedu Nketia leads with 41%, Julius Debrah, 11% and 48% undecided.
- When delegates were asked whether they agree or disagree with the suggestion that Asiedu Nketia should stay on as the chairman of the party, the poll shows that 58% of the delegates agree while 21% disagree and 20% have no opinion. In the July 2026 poll, 61% agreed while 25% disagreed and 24% did not have an opinion.
- The poll shows that among the delegates who agreed that Asiedu Nketia should remain chairman, 54% preferred Ato Forson, 19% Asiedu Nketia and 27% are undecided. However, among those who disagreed, 74% preferred Asiedu Nketia, 19% preferred Ato Forson while 27% did not have an opinion. For those who did not have an opinion on the call, Ato Forson is preferred by 26%, Asiedu Nketia, 14% and 59% were undecided.
- Again, on question of whether the NDC should elect an economist because of the perceived handling of the economy, to face Dr Bawumia, who is also an economist, the poll shows that 56% agree while 20% disagree and 24% had no opinion. The July 2026 poll shows 58% agreed, 23% disagreed and 19% had no opinion.

Summary of Findings

- Among delegates who prefer the NDC to elect an economist, 55% preferred Ato Forson, 22% Asiedu Nketia, and 23% were undecided. Among those who disagreed, 65% preferred Asiedu Nketia, 16% Ato Forson, and 19% were undecided. Among those with no opinion, 28% preferred Ato Forson, 17% Asiedu Nketia, and 55% were undecided.
- In the race for NDC national chairman, Nii Lantey Vanderpuye and Samuel Ofosu Ampofo are tied at 17%. Vanderpuye, who led with nearly 27% in July 2026, fell by 10 percentage points. Ofosu Ampofo also declined by 2 points and did not capitalise on Vanderpuye's drop.
- The inclusion of Goosie Tanoh, who is in charge of the 24-Hour Economy, did not materially change the race. The field remains open, with Nii Lantey Vanderpuye and Samuel Ofosu Ampofo the clear grassroots favourites.
- Overall, Nii Lantey Vanderpuye and Samuel Ofosu Ampofo each attract 17% of the vote. They are followed by Awudu Sorfo Azorka (5%), Alhaji Sinare (3%), Goosie Tanoh (2%), Kwasi Opong-Fosu (1%), and Nii Armah Ashitey (1%); 53% remain undecided.
- The poll sampled 3,615 delegates from the 7,600 delegates polled in July 2026, using random-probability telephone sampling. The completed-response rate was 93%.

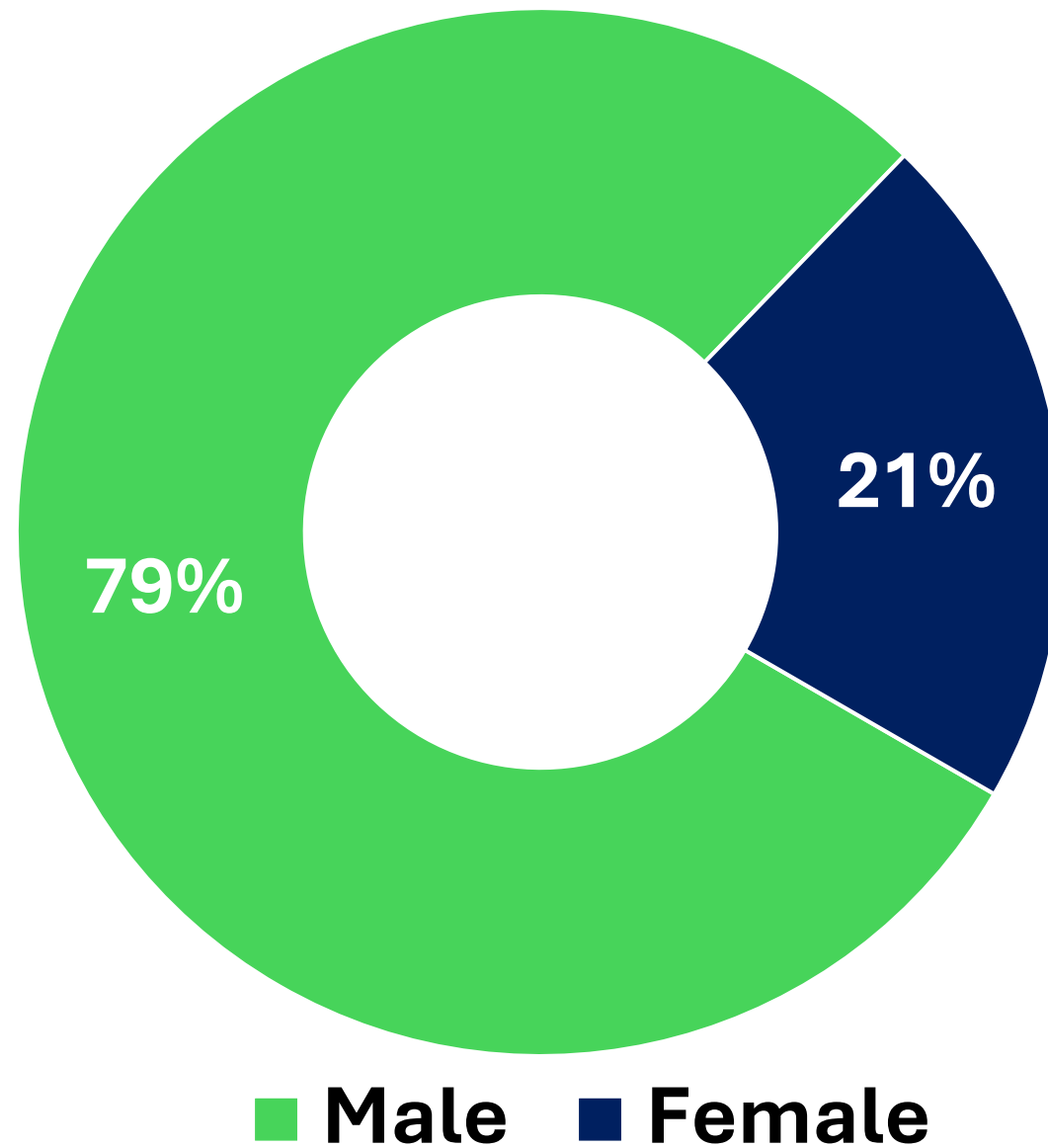

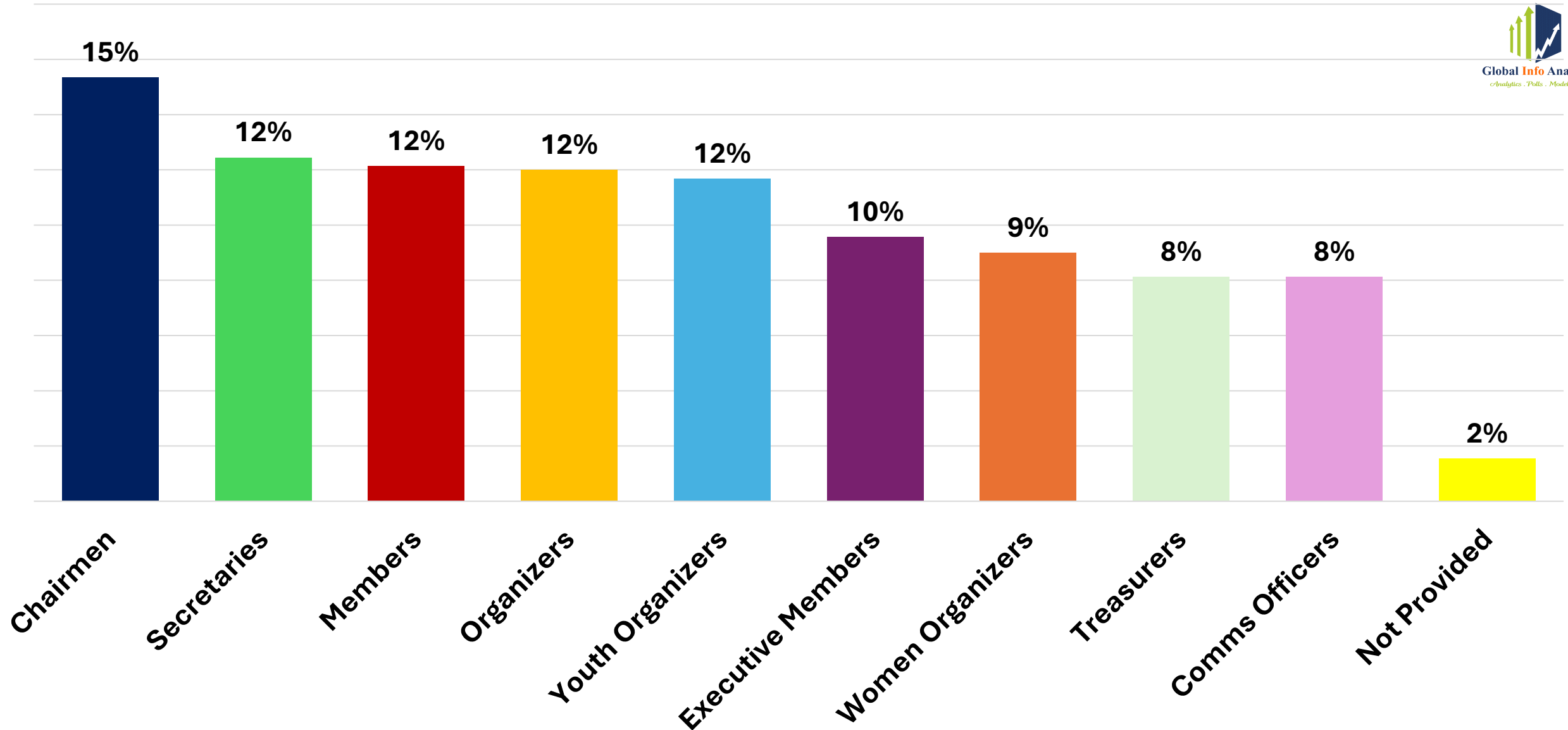

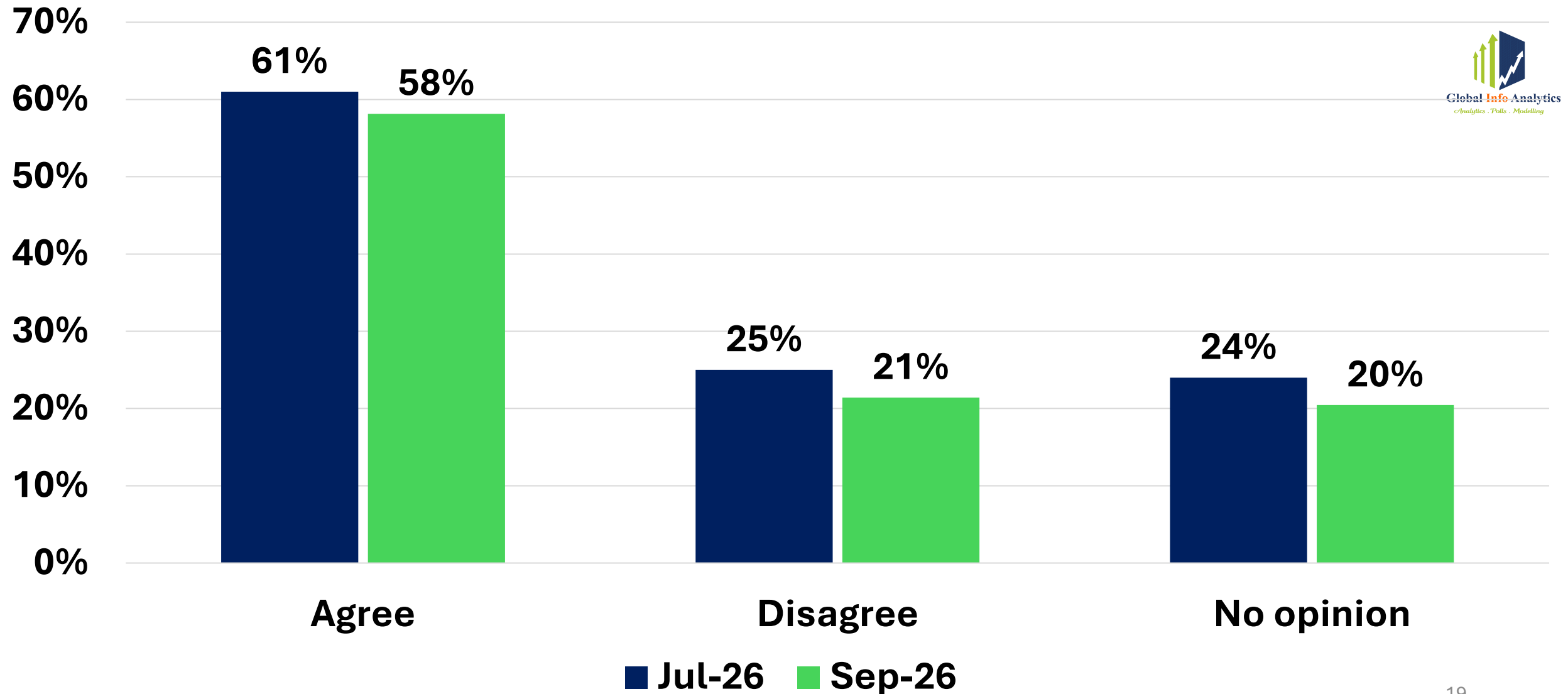

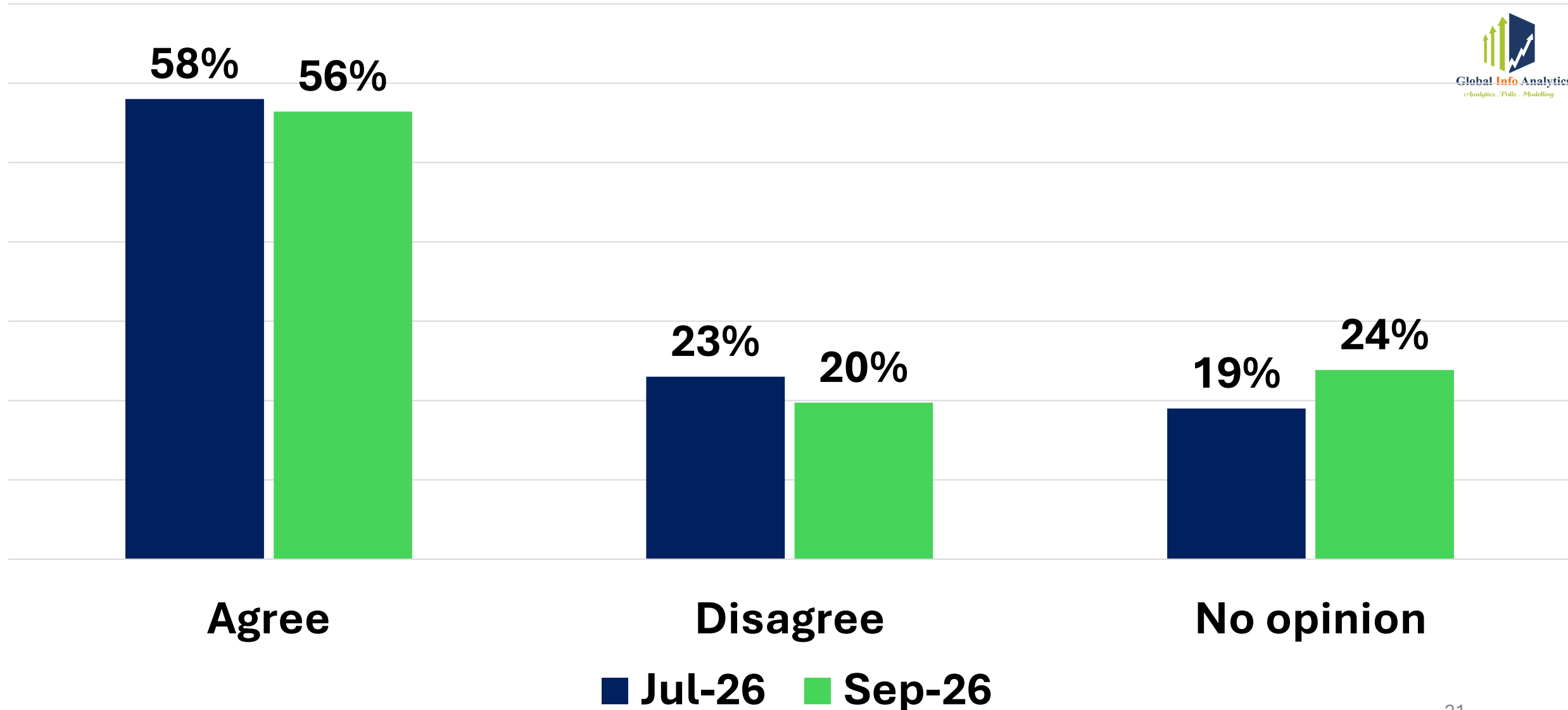

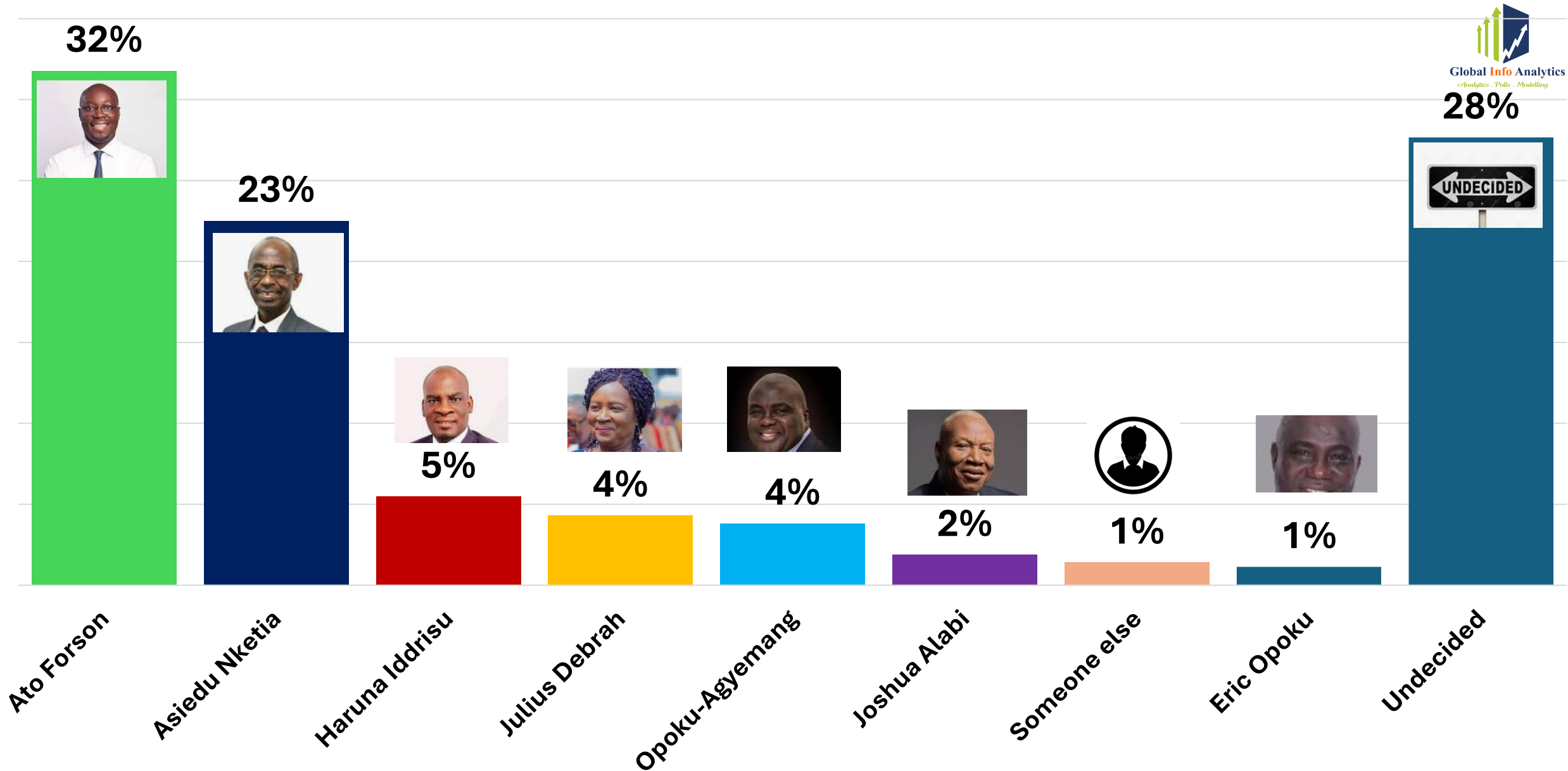

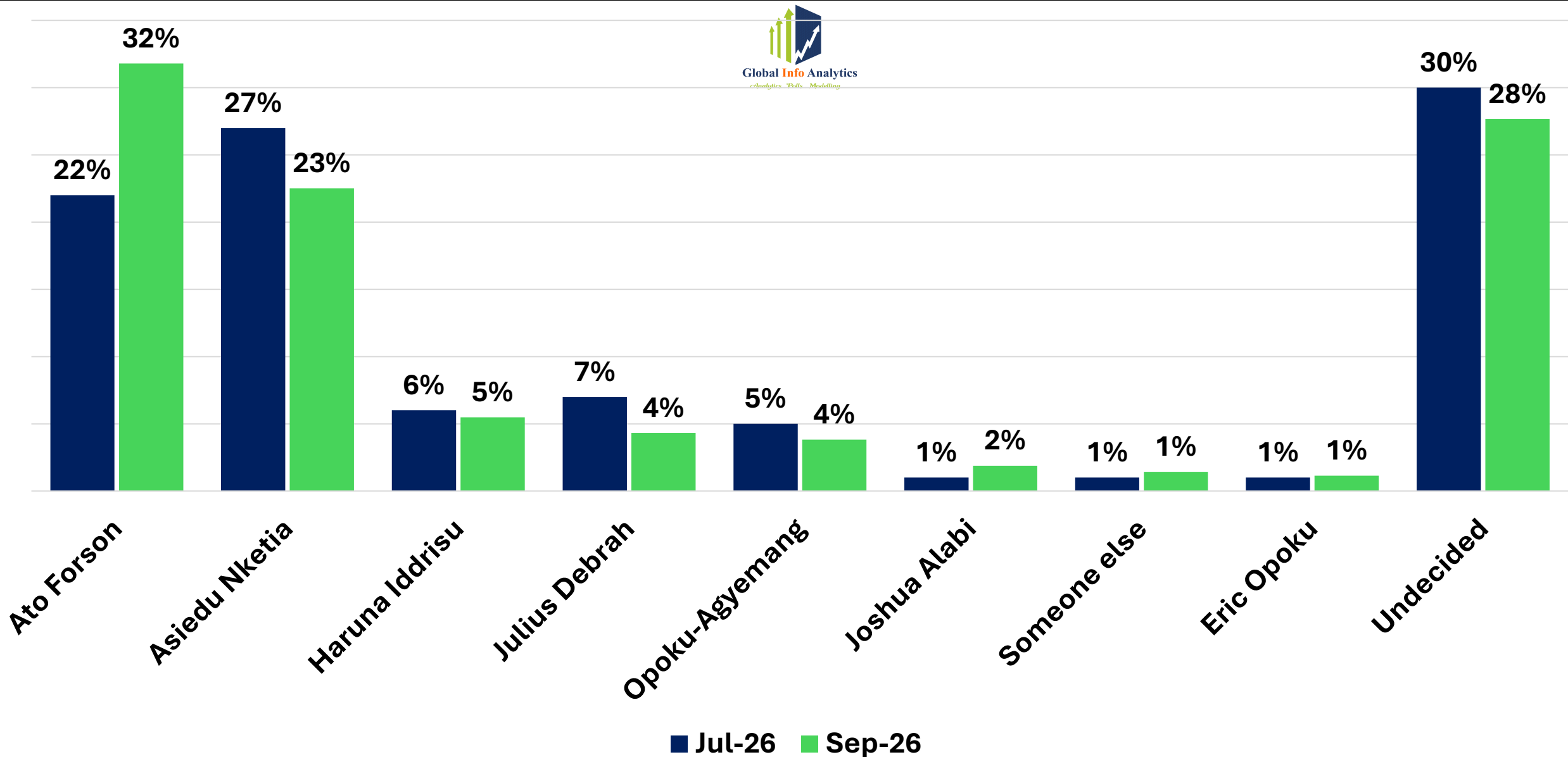

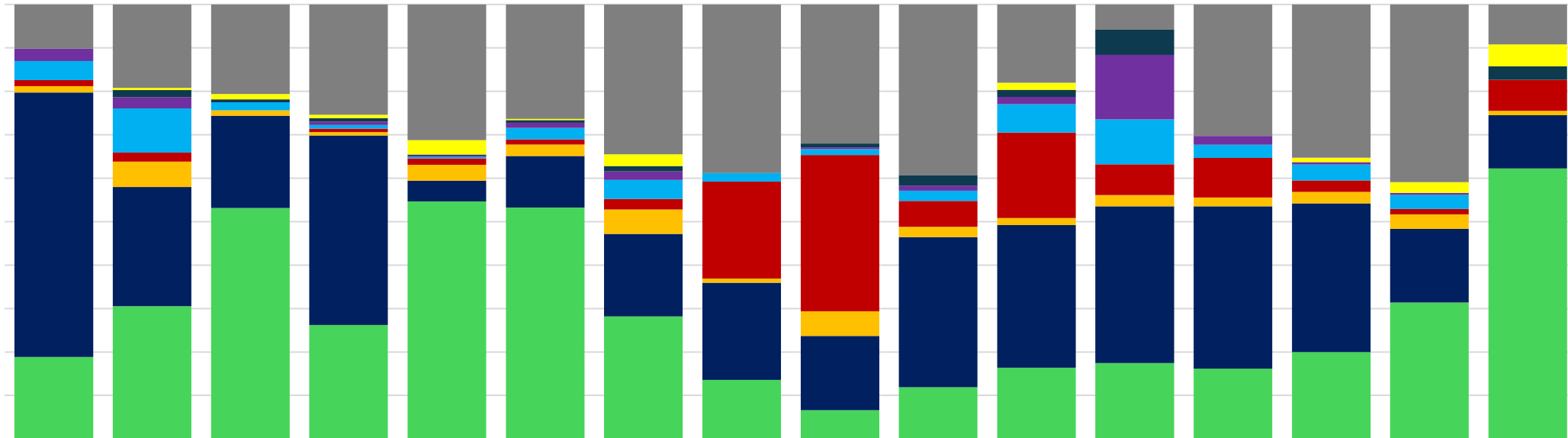

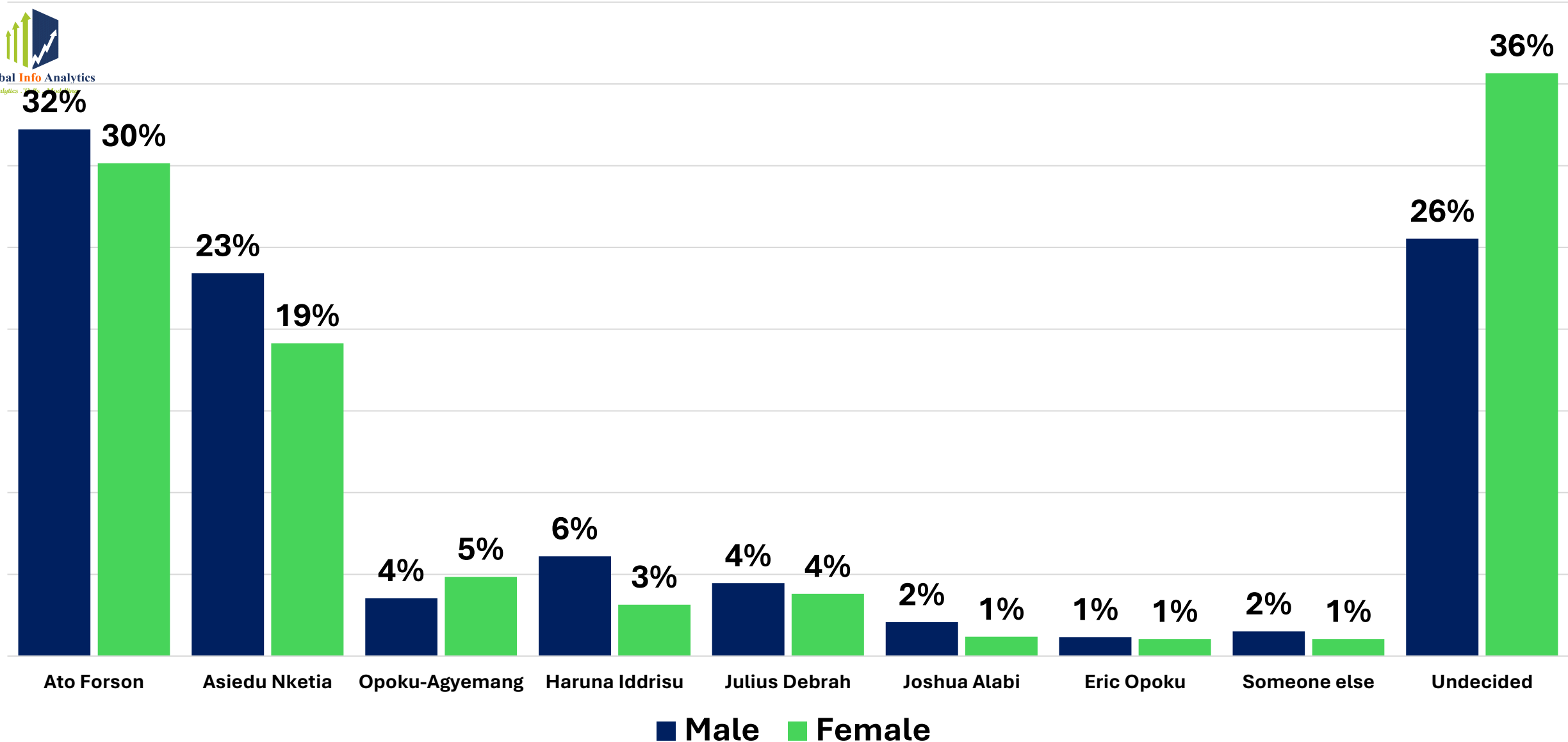

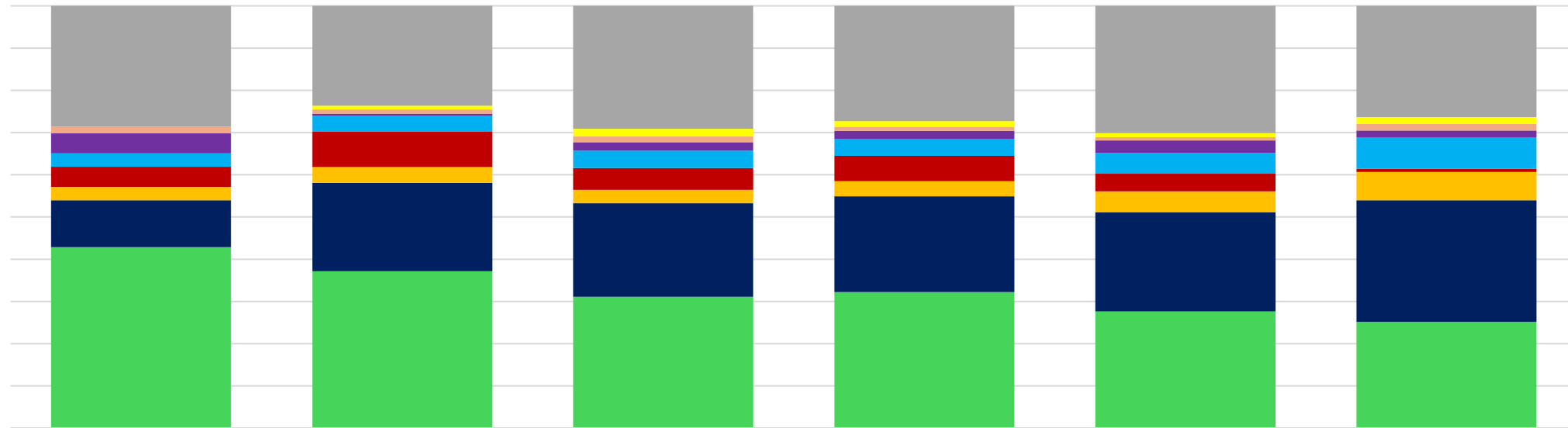
Who Leads NDC in 2028-Gender

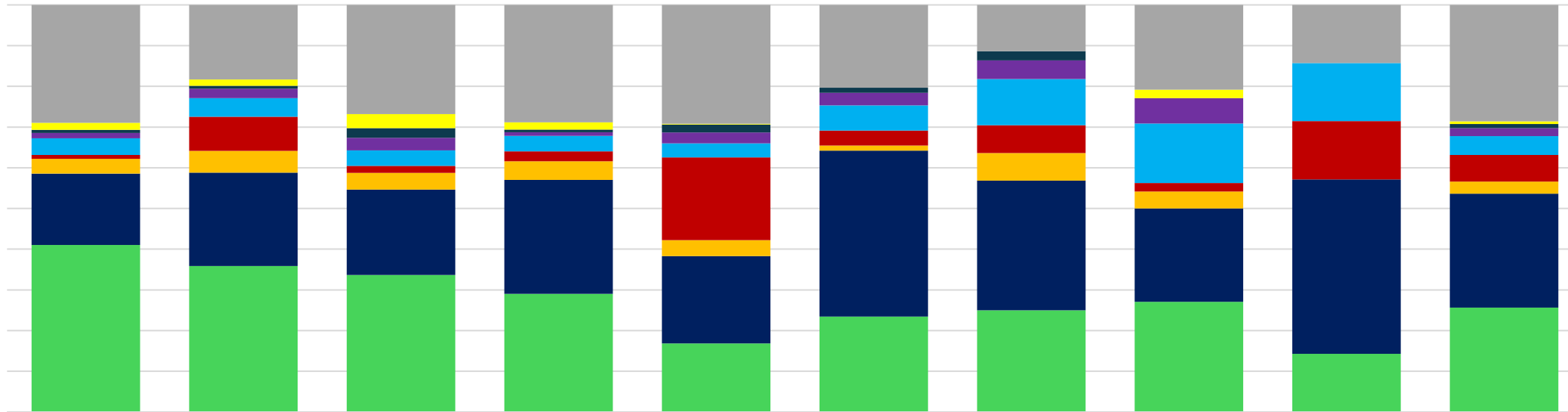

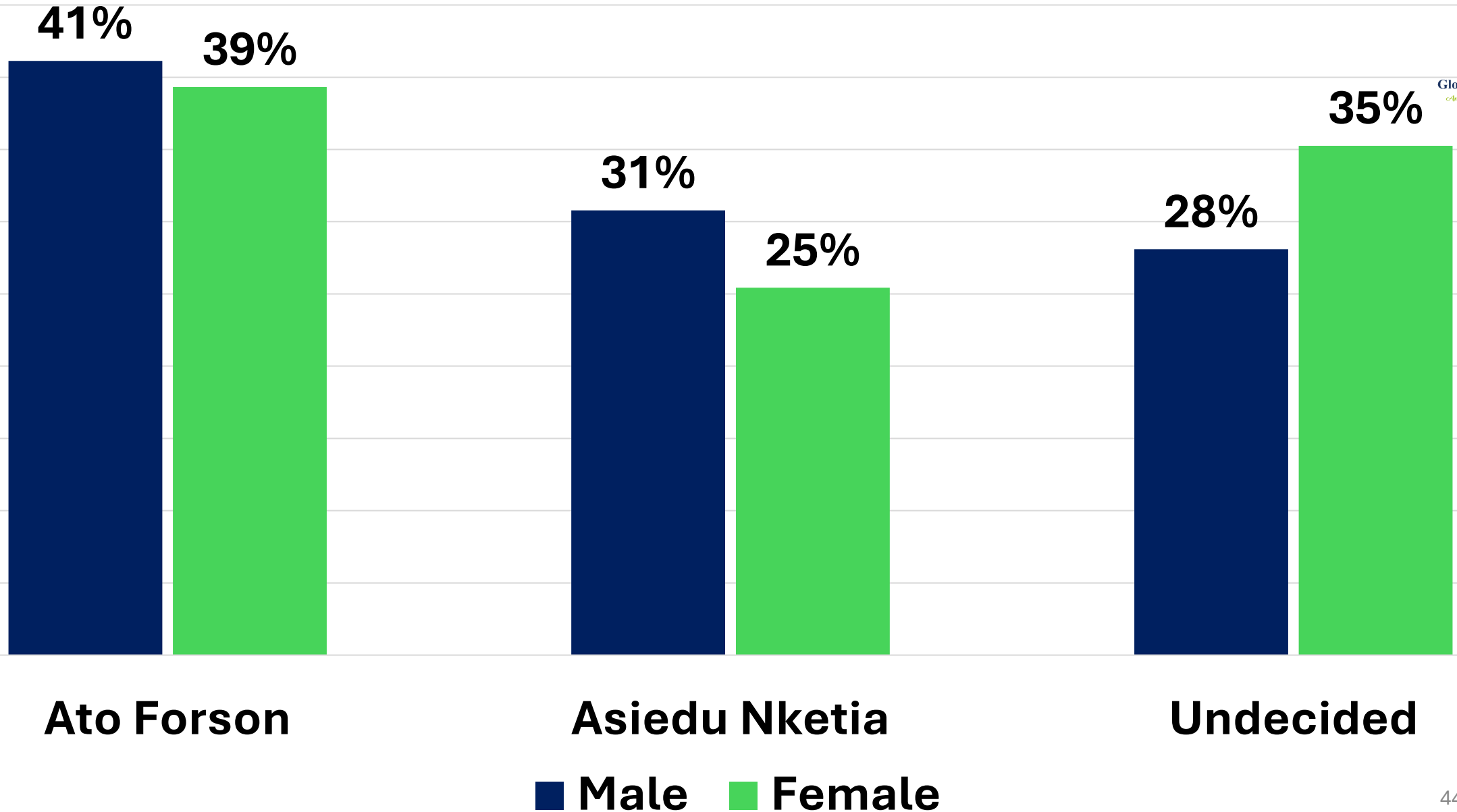

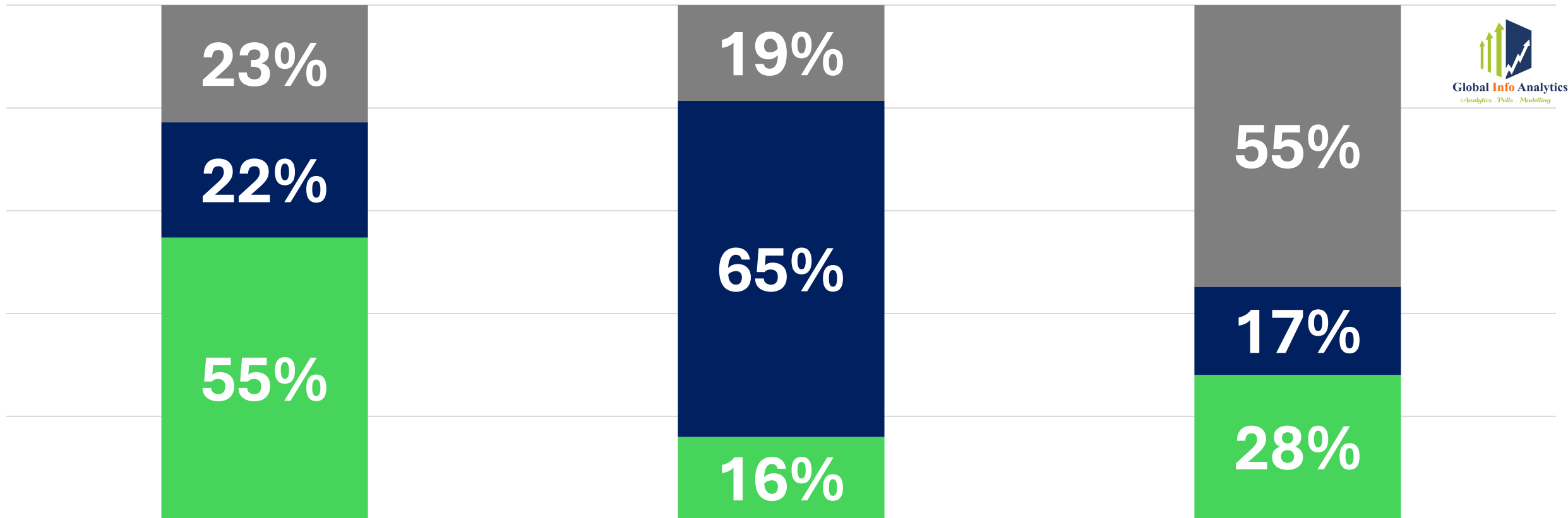

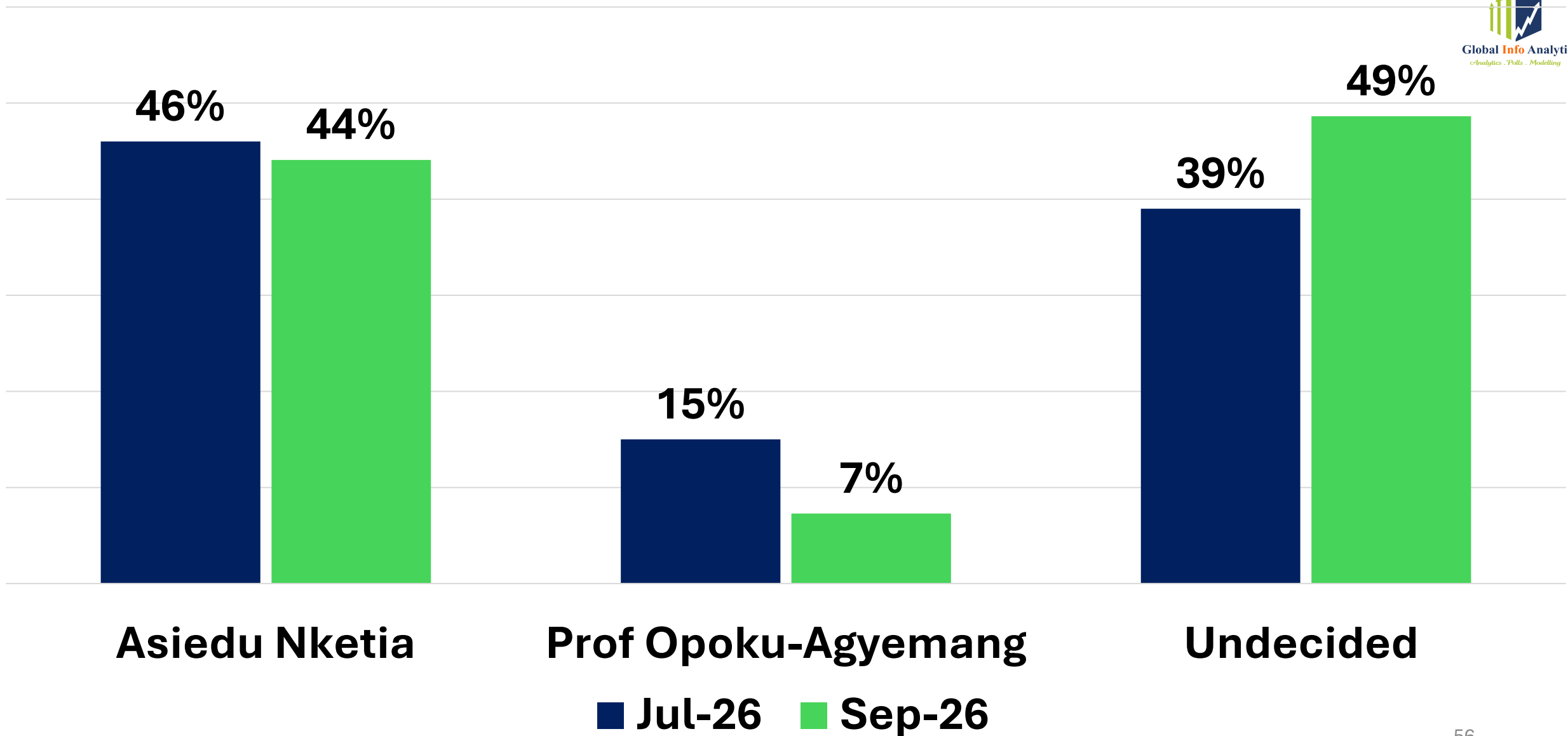

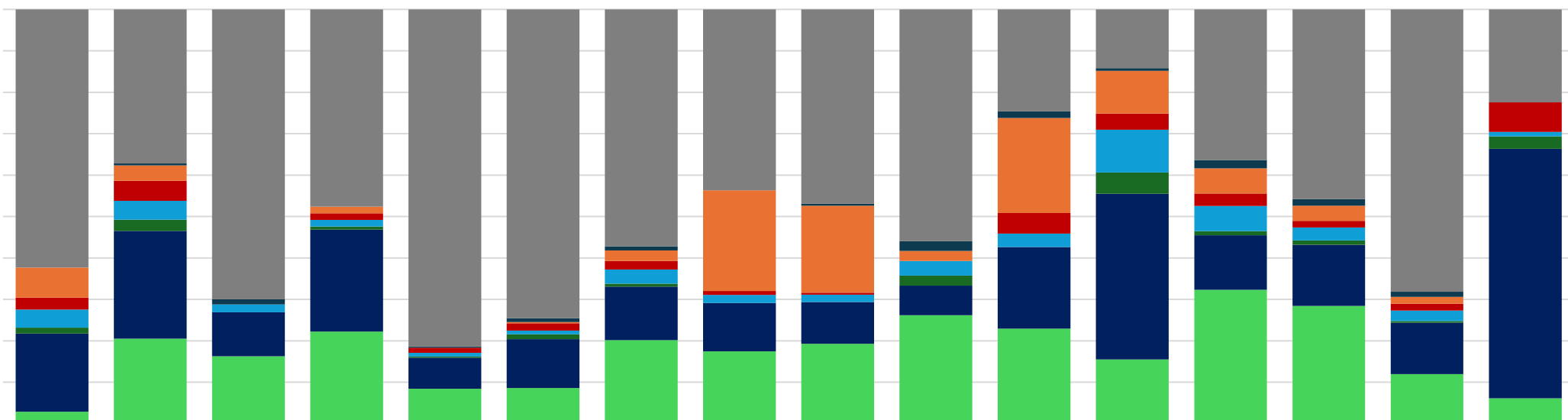
NDC Chairmanship Race-September 2026
